



### FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN (APPLIED, ACCEPTED, AND ENROLLED) FALL SEMESTERS 1995 - 1999




#### NEW FRESHMEN ENROLLED BY STATUS FALL SEMESTERS 1995-1999


### New Freshmen Enrolled By Gender Fall Semesters 1995 - 1999




### Percentage of New Students Enrolled Fall 1999











### ACT AVERAGE OF FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN FALL 1995-1999

### ACT AVERAGE OF FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN FALL SEMESTERS 1995-1999









Fall 1999 - Graduate Enrollment







**Spring 2000 - Graduate Enrollment** 









### **FALL 1999 GENERAL ENROLLMENT CHARACTERISTICS**




### FALL 1999 ENROLLMENT BY SCHOOL & MAJOR AREA-OF-STUDY







# Faculty Roster By School/Department Fall 1999






