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GENERAL INFORMATION

INSTITUTIONAL MISSION

South Carolina State University, a senior comprehensive-teaching institution, is committed to providing affordable and accessible quality undergraduate and graduate degree programs. This public university with a student population between 4,000 and 5,000 is located in Orangeburg, an area that has a traditional rural, agricultural economy which has expanded to include a business and industrial focus that is national and international in scope. South Carolina State University's 1890 land-grant legacy of service to the citizenry of the state is ensured through its collaborative efforts with local, rural, and state-wide businesses, public education, colleges and industry. This symbiotic relationship provides a catalyst that spurs reciprocal economic and social growth for the university, state, nation and the international community-at-large.

South Carolina State University, founded in 1896 as an historically Black co-educational institution, embraces diversity among its students, faculty, staff and programs. While maintaining its traditional focus, the University is fully committed to providing life-long learning opportunities for the citizens of the state and qualified students of varied talents and backgrounds in a caring and nurturing learning environment.

South Carolina State University, through instruction, research and service activities, prepares highly skilled, competent, economically and socially aware graduates to meet life's challenges and demands that enable them to work and live productively in a dynamic, global society. 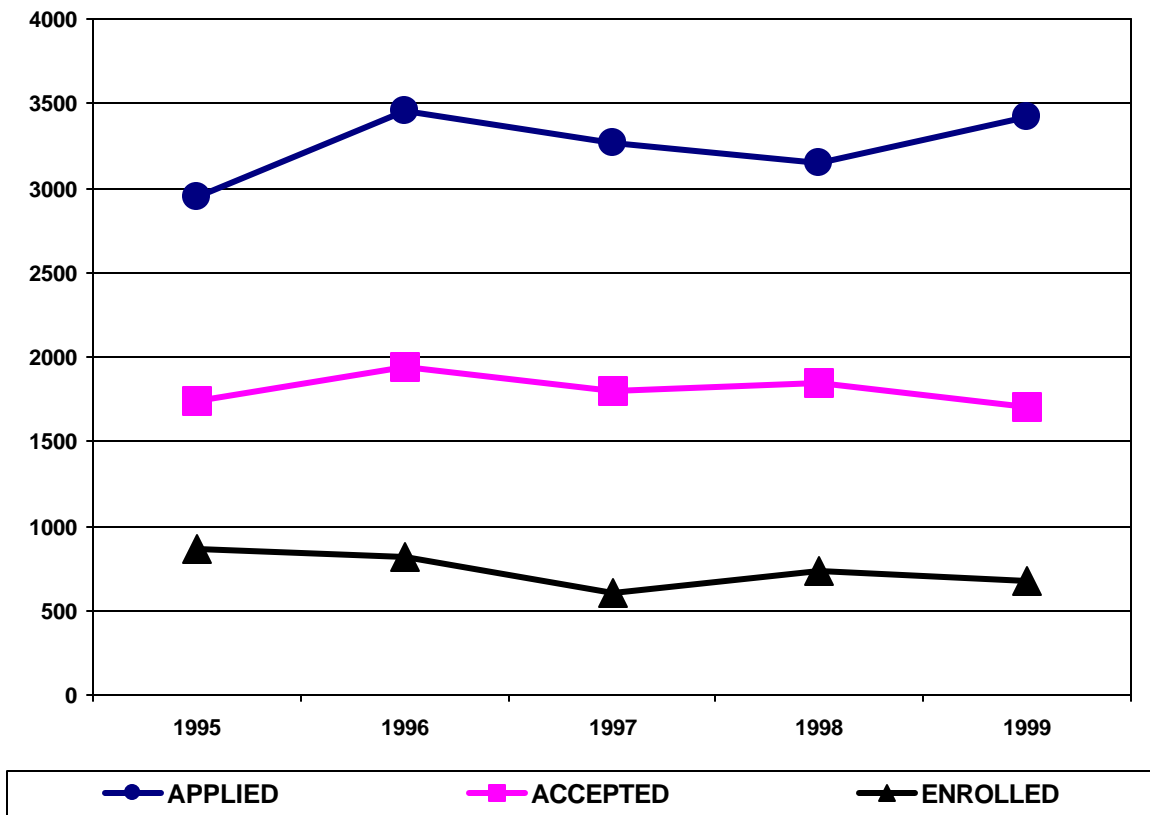

FALL SEMESTERS 1995 - 1999**

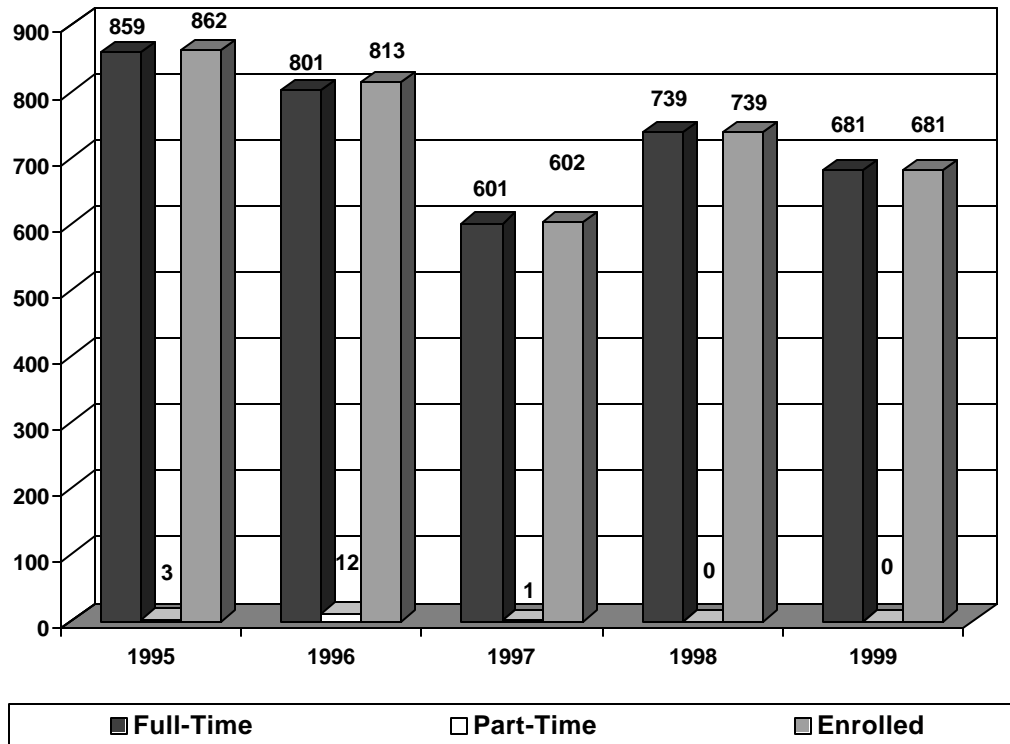

FALL SEMESTERS 1995-1999**

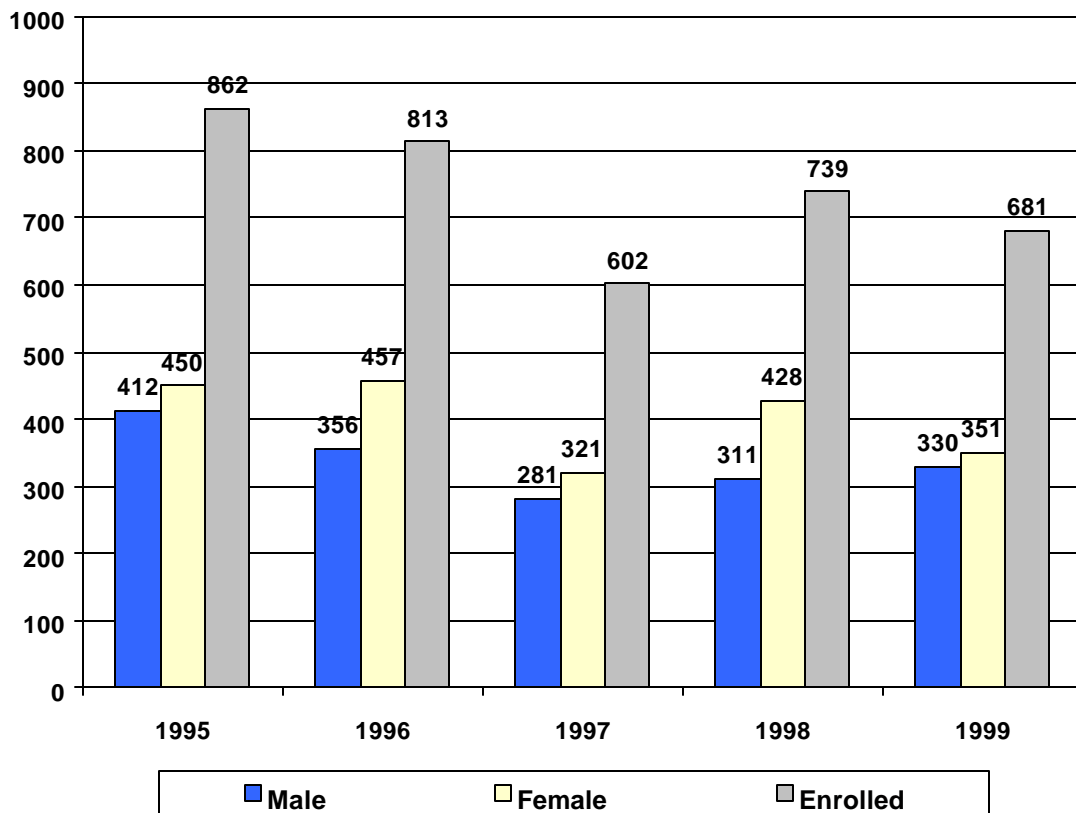

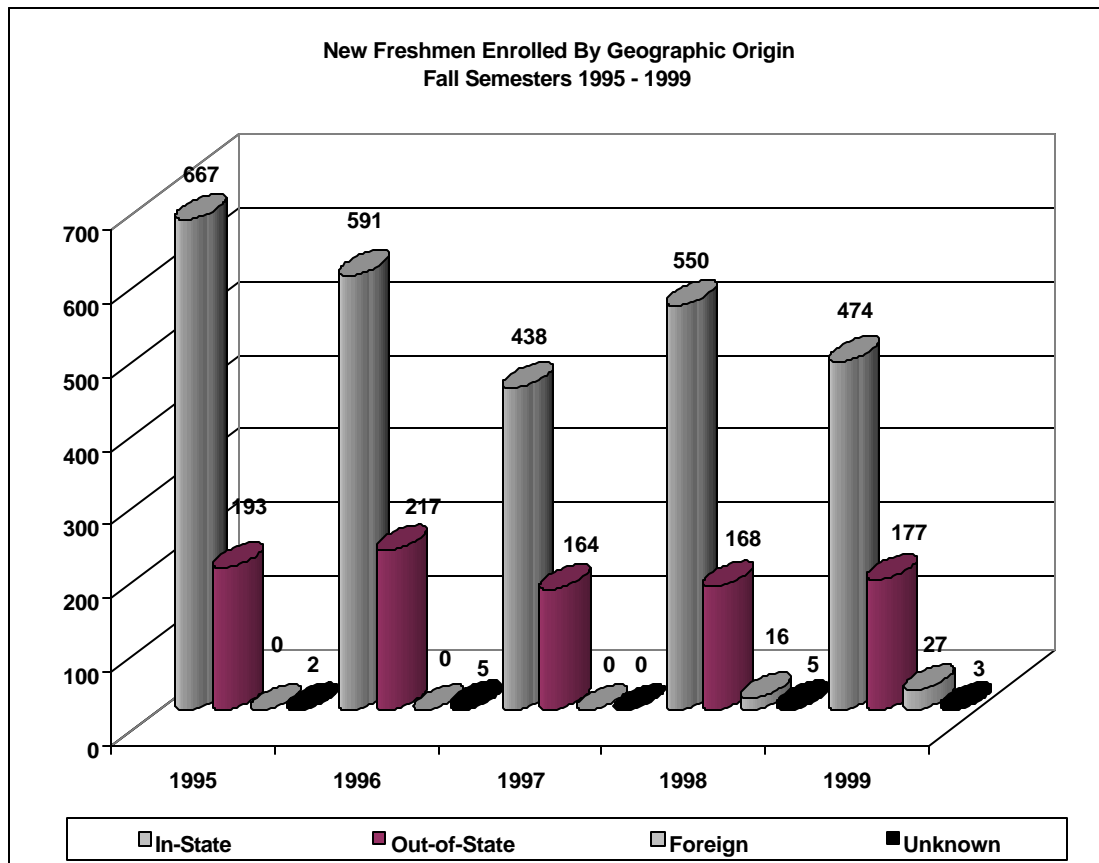
New Freshmen Enrolled By Gender

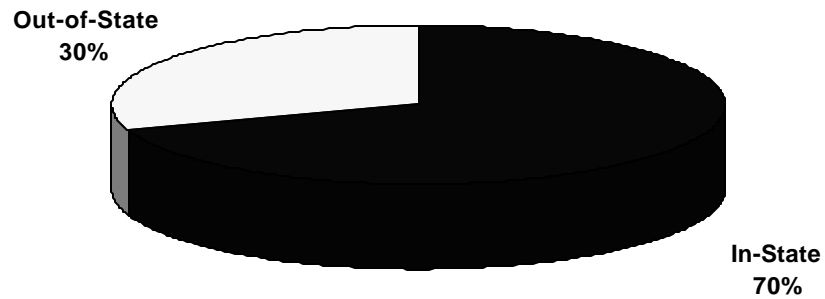

Fall 1999

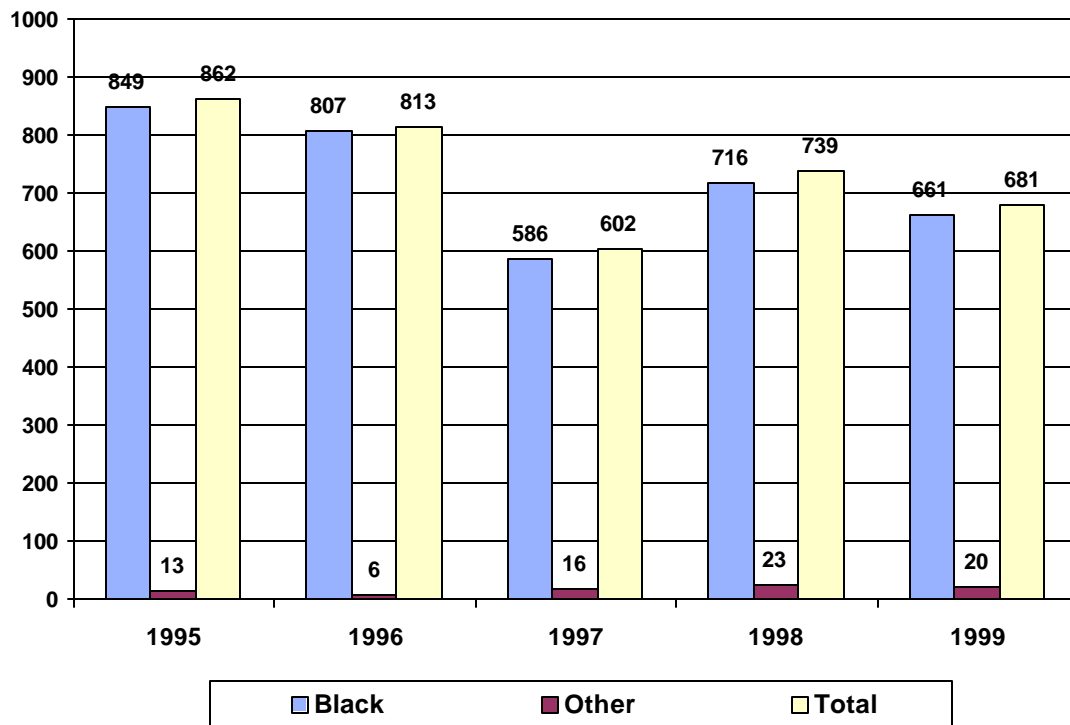

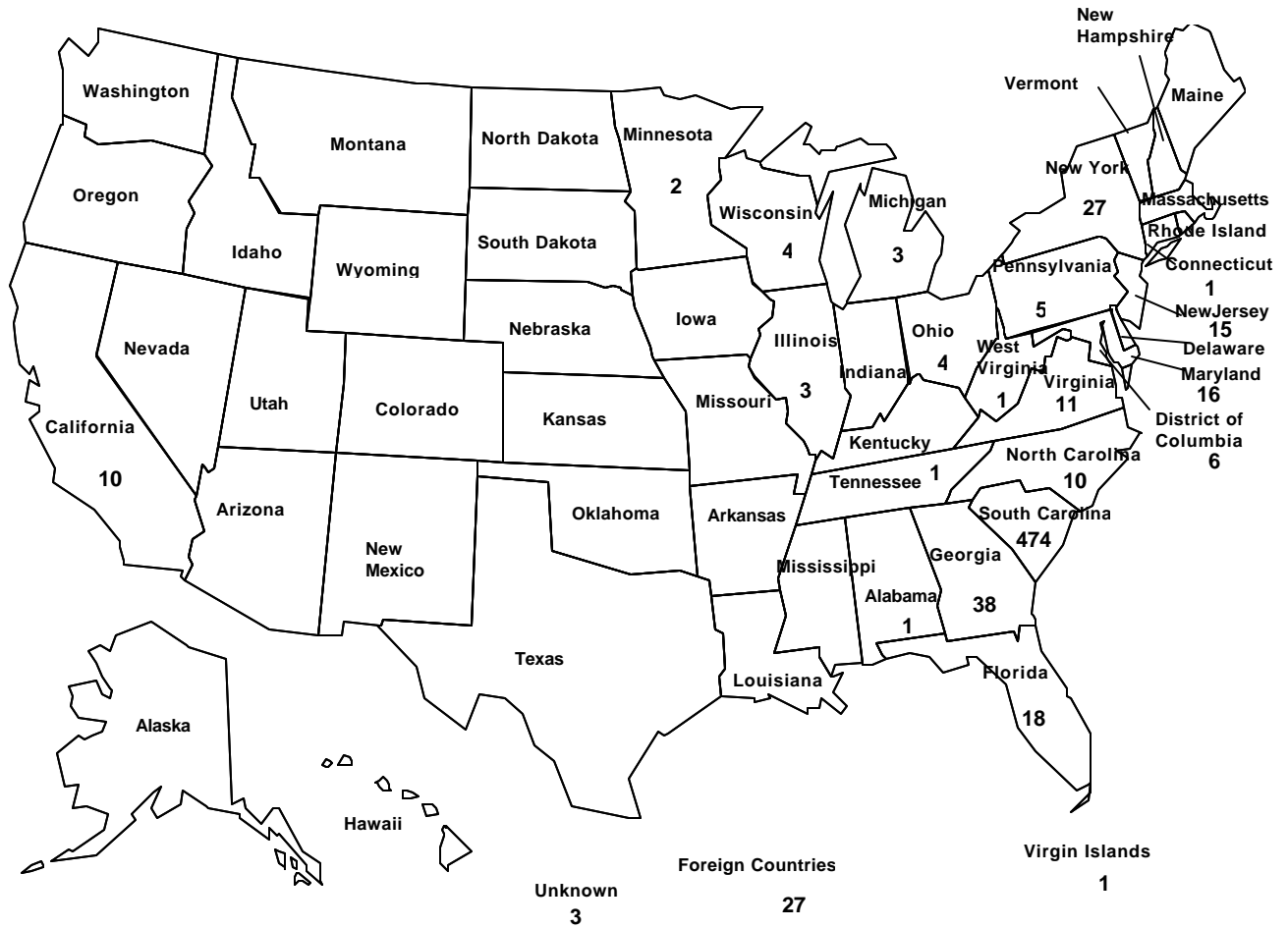

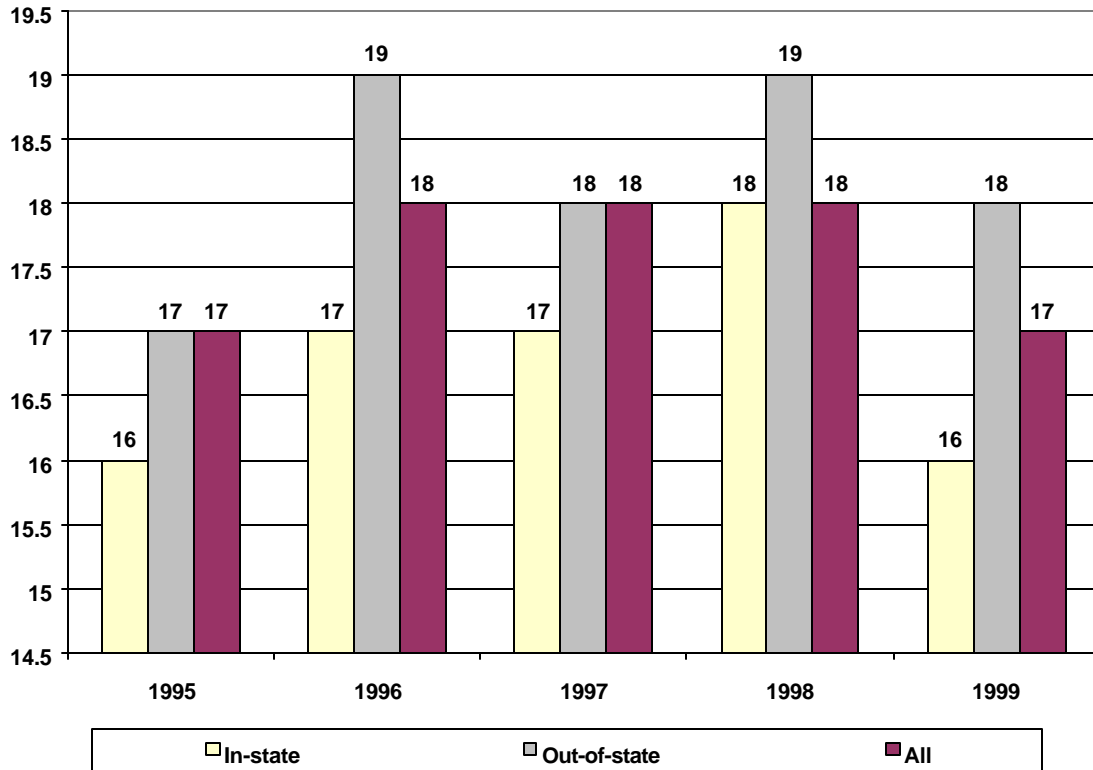

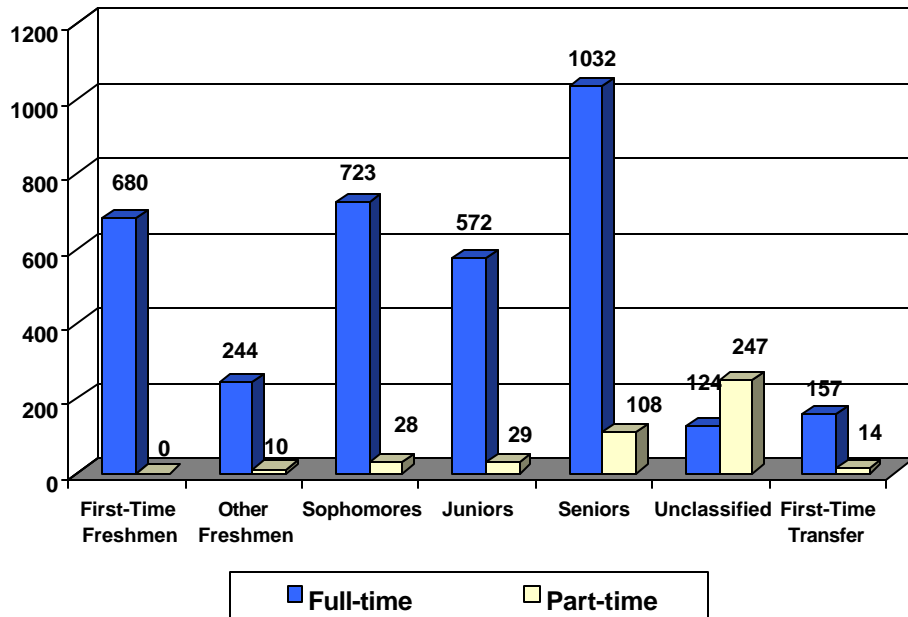

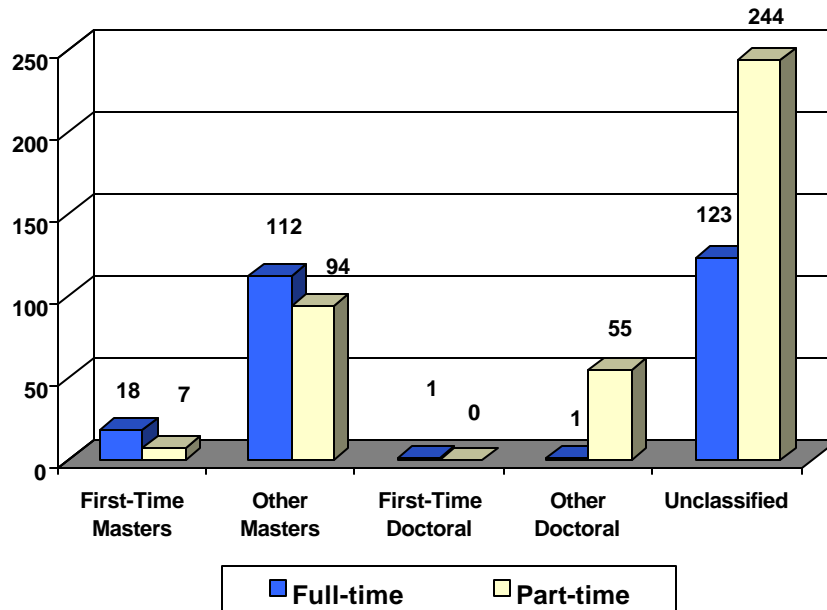

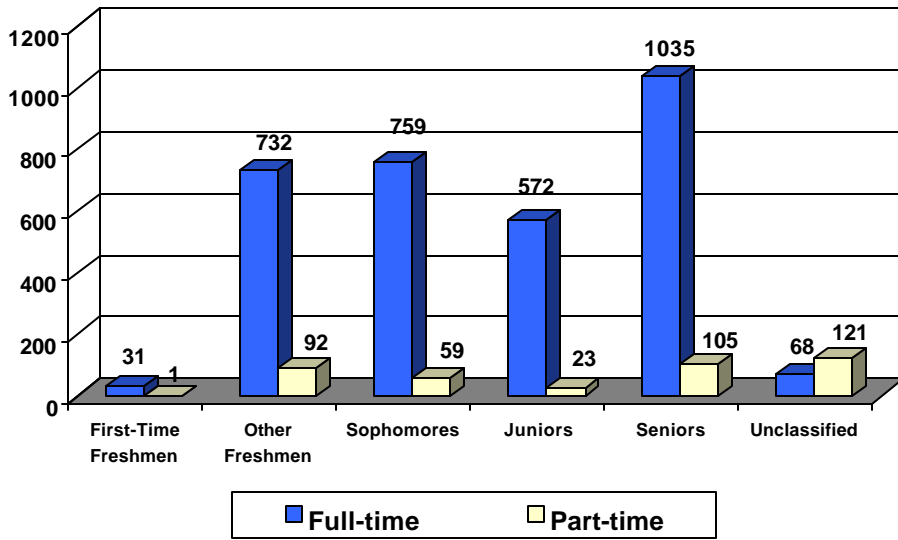

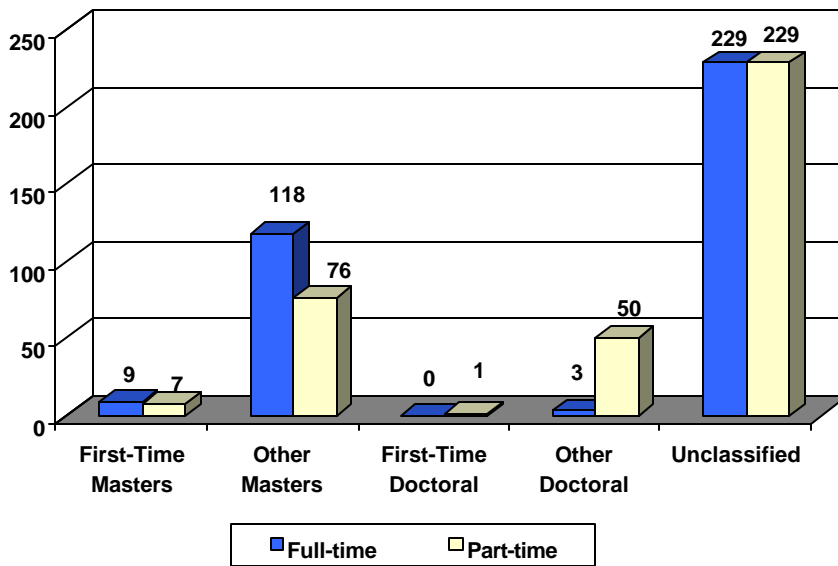

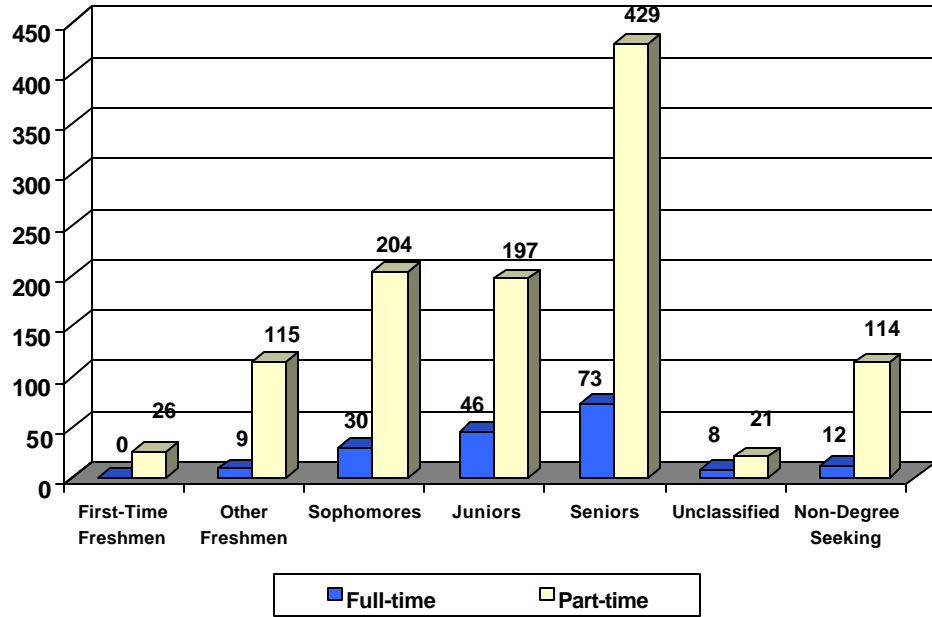

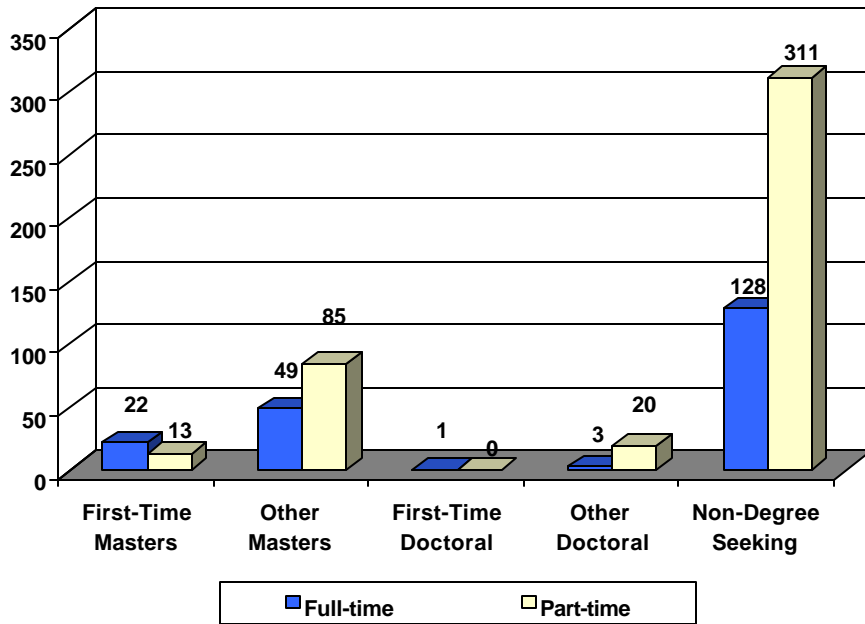

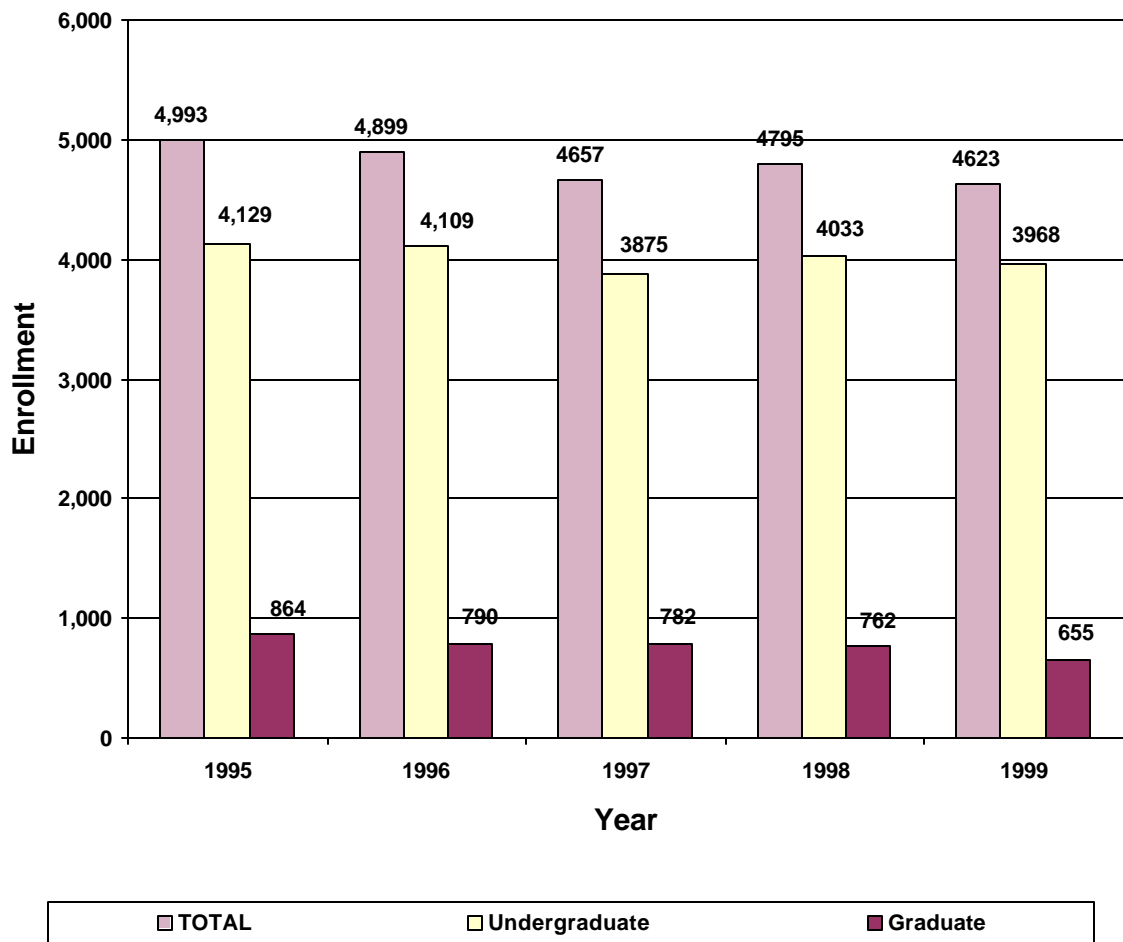

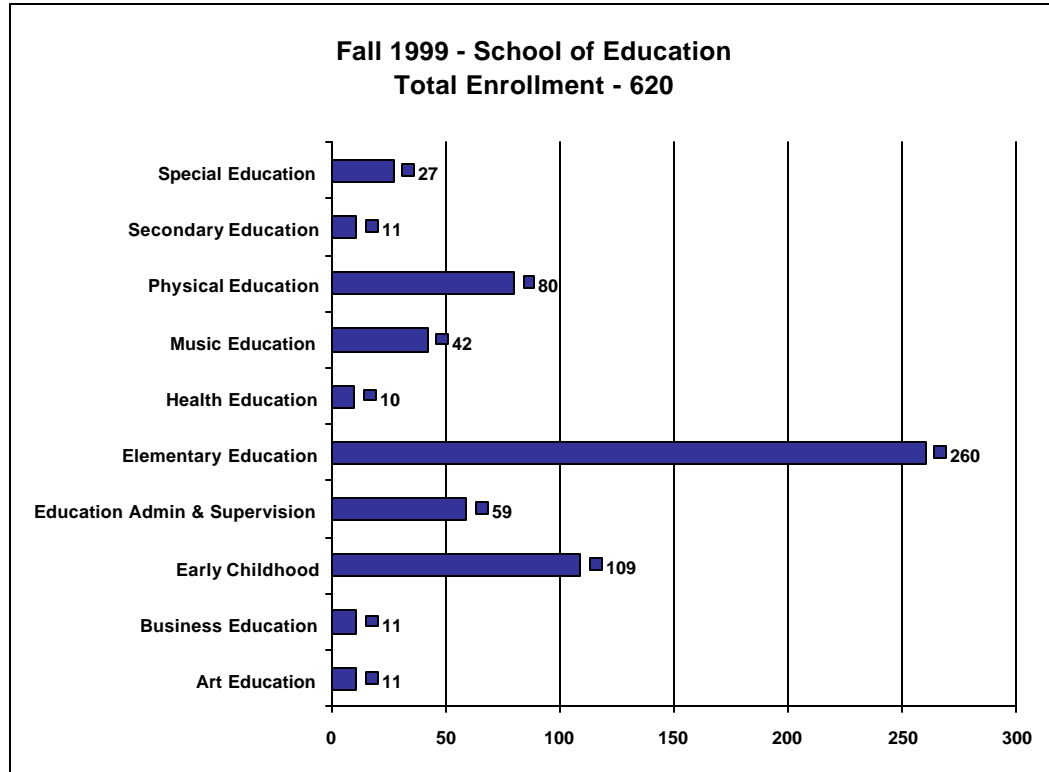
FALL 1999 ENROLLMENT BY SCHOOL & MAJOR AREA-OF-STUDY

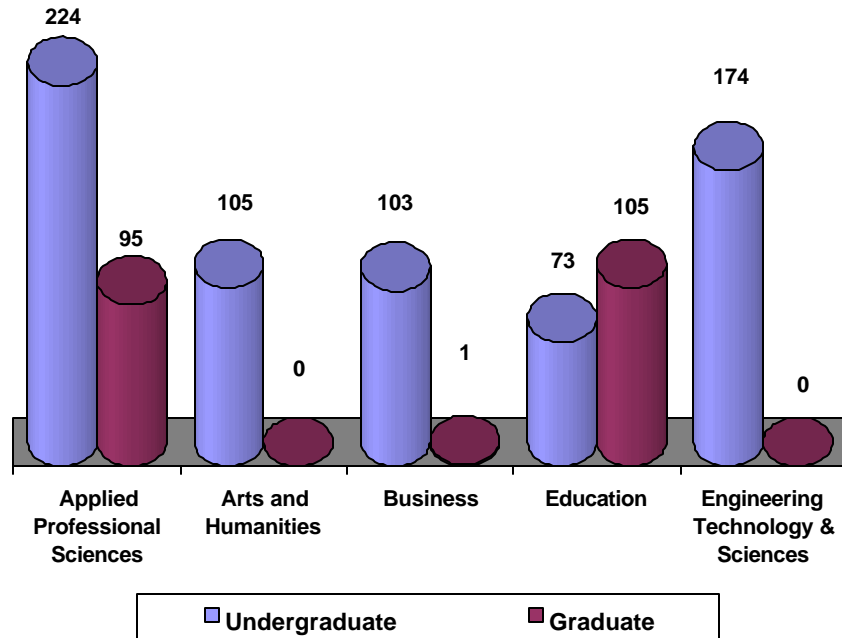
DEGREES AWARDED BY CATEGORY

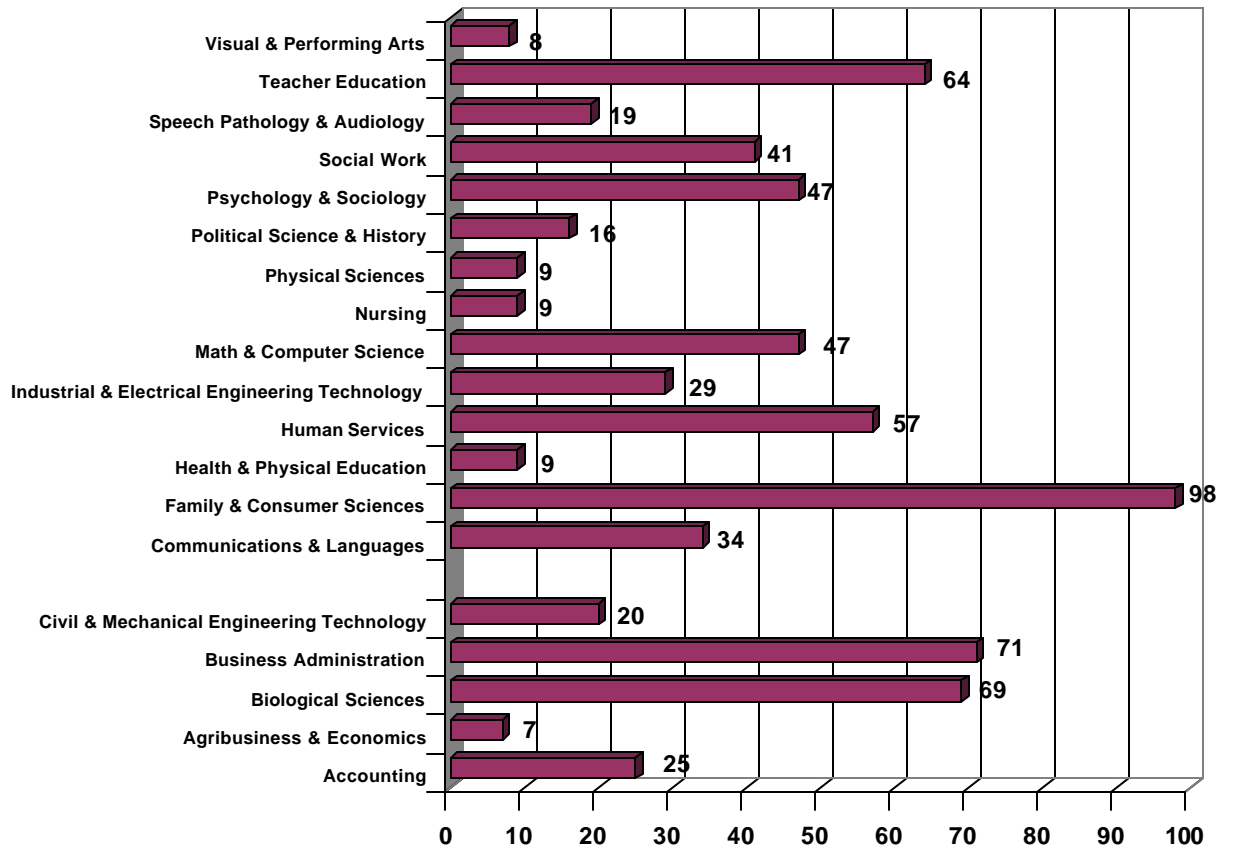

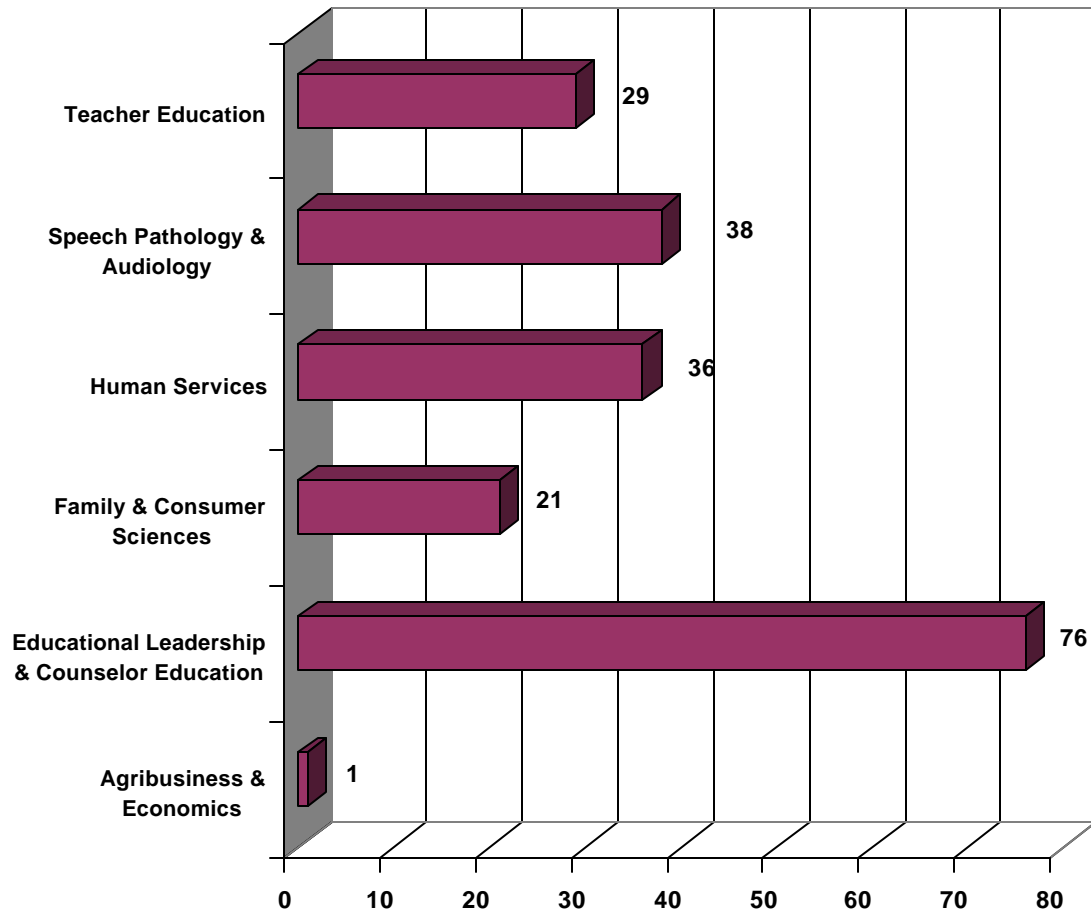

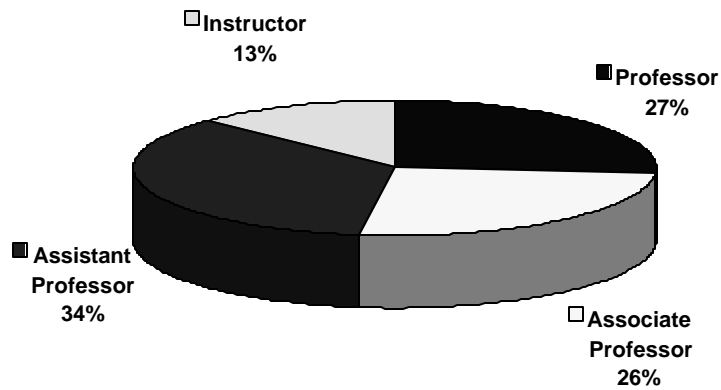

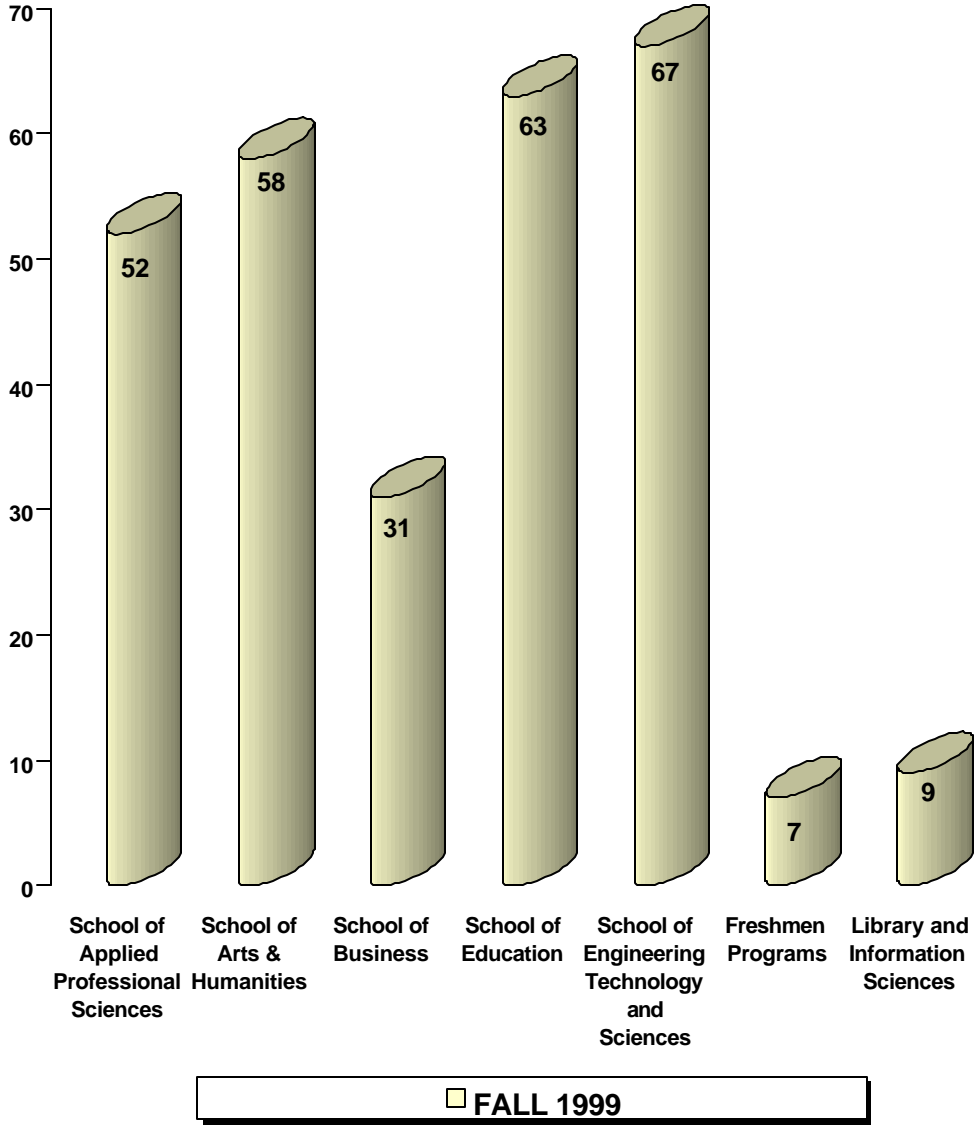

Fall 1999**

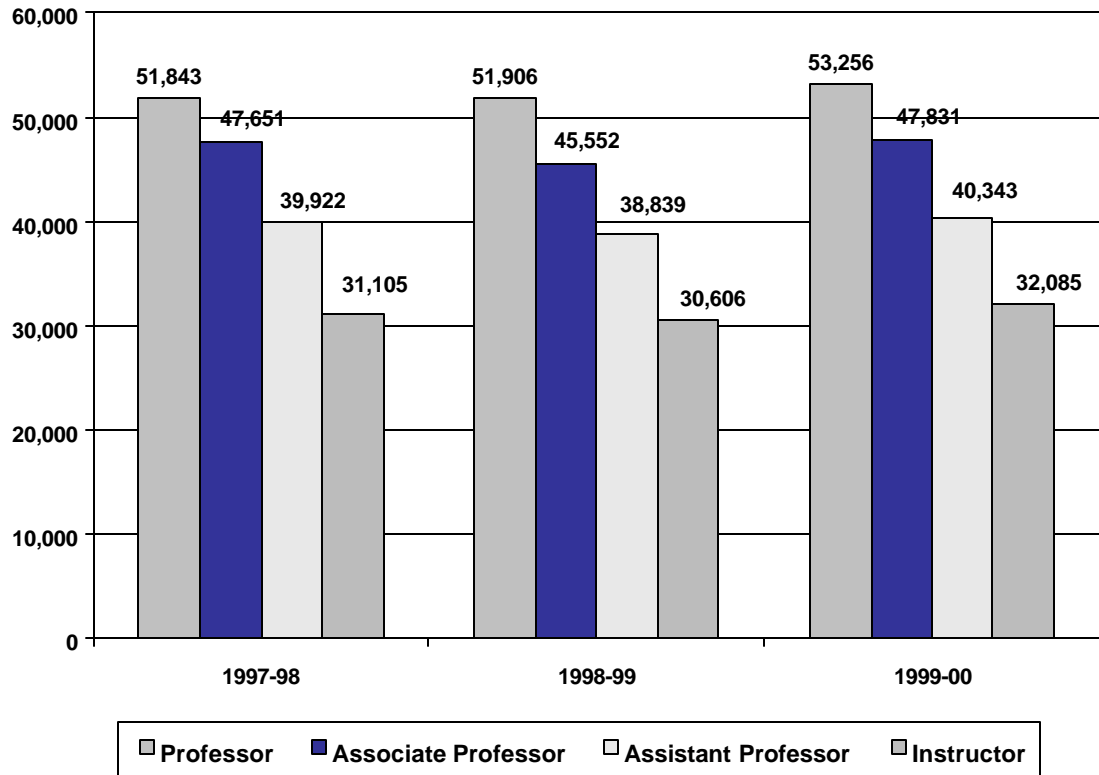

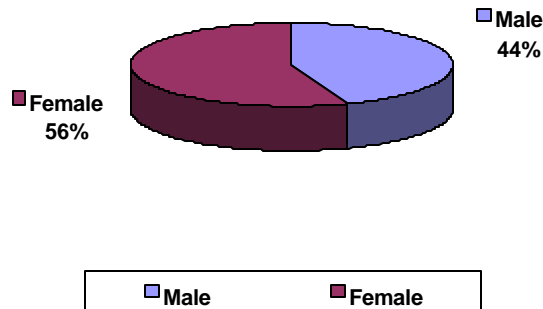

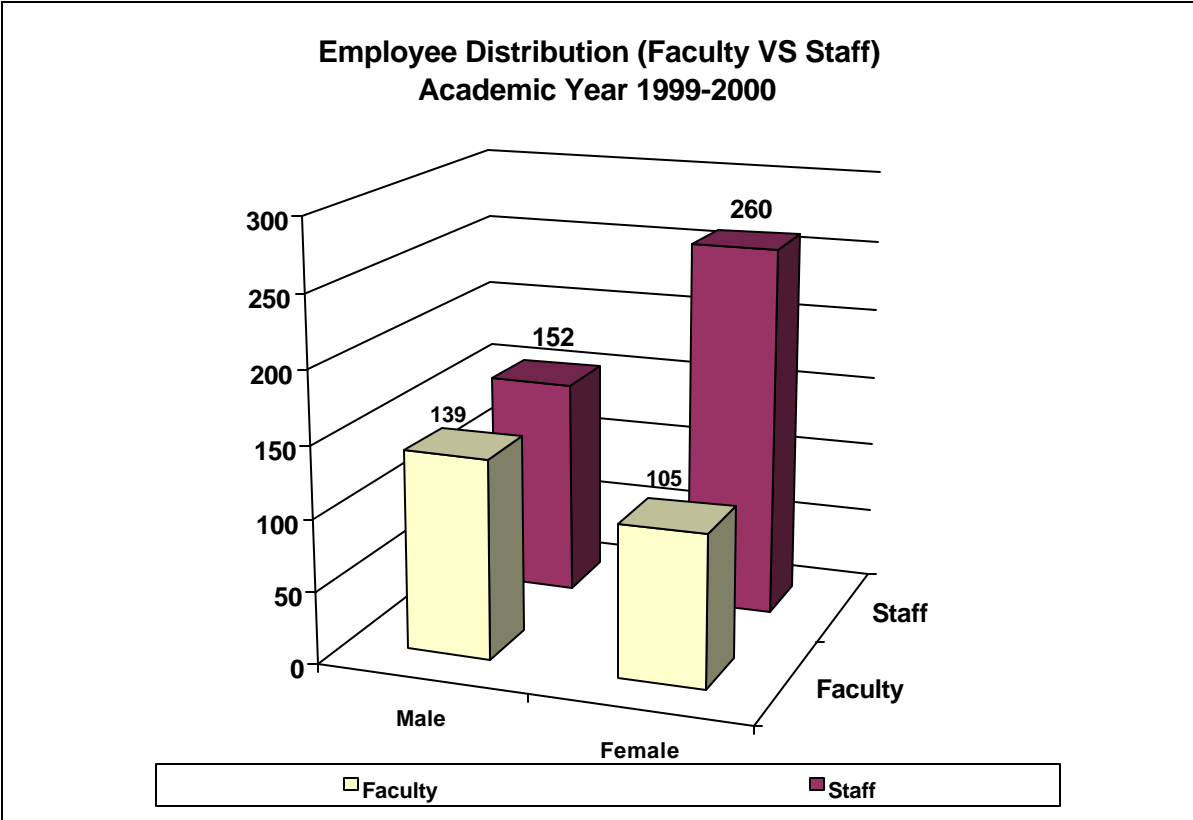
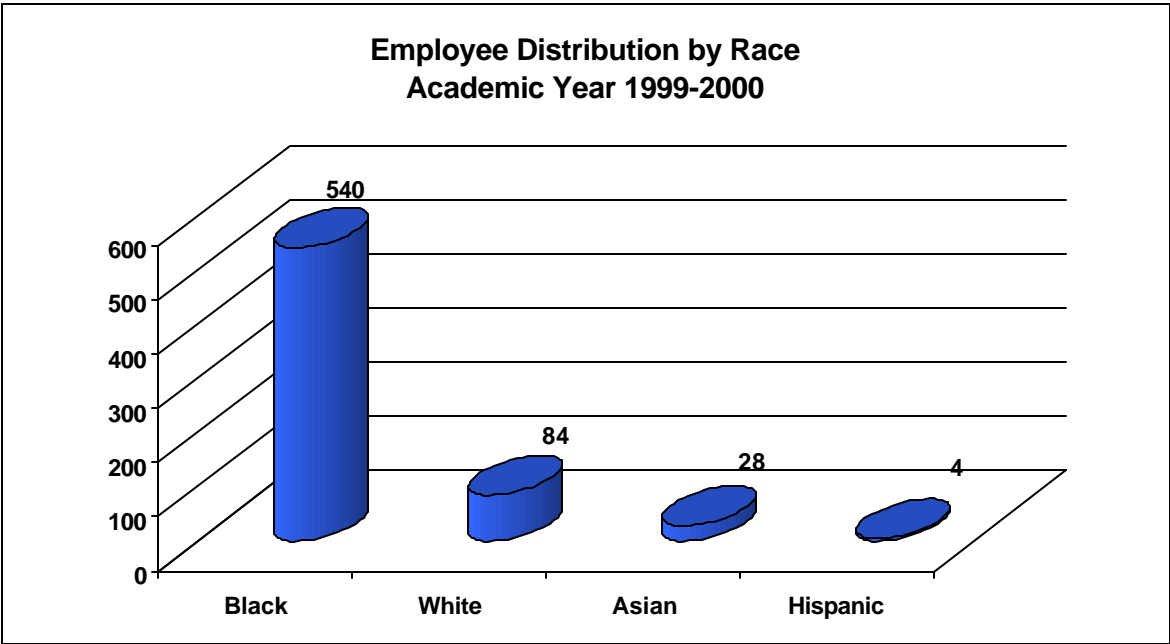

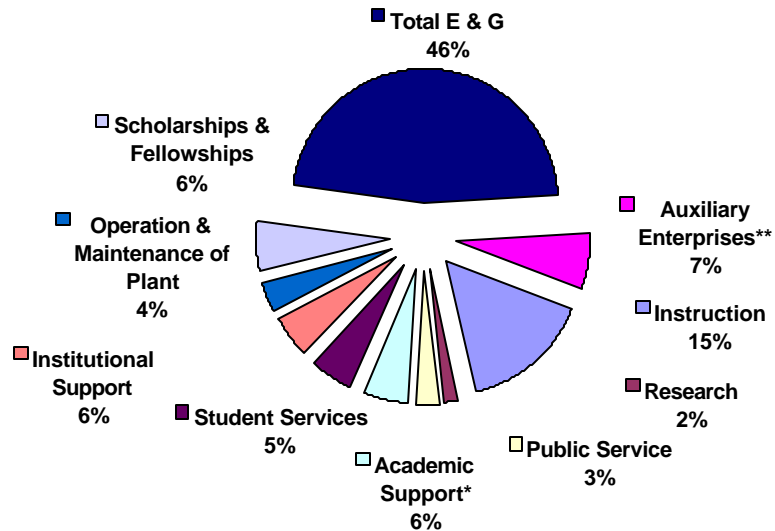

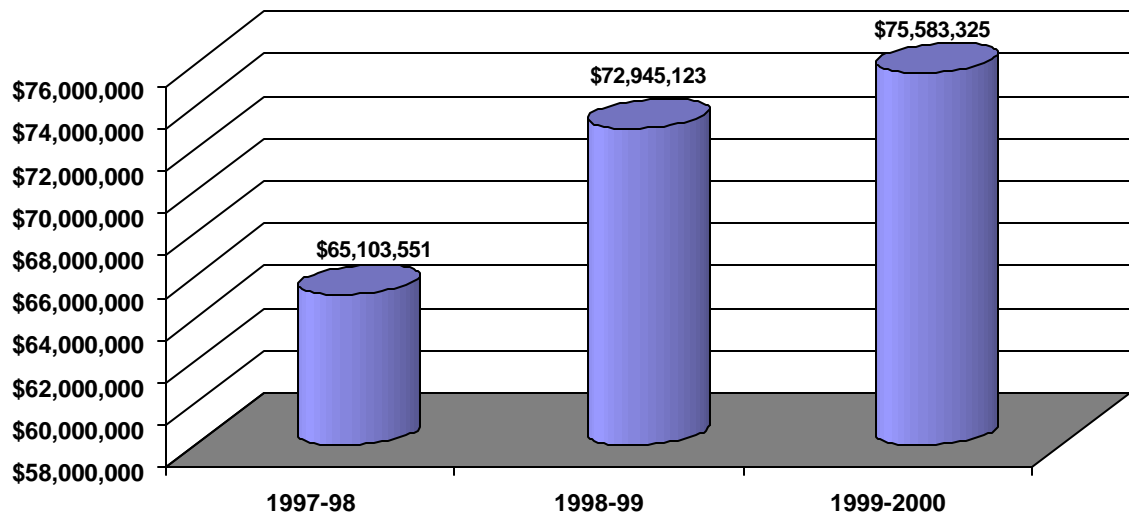

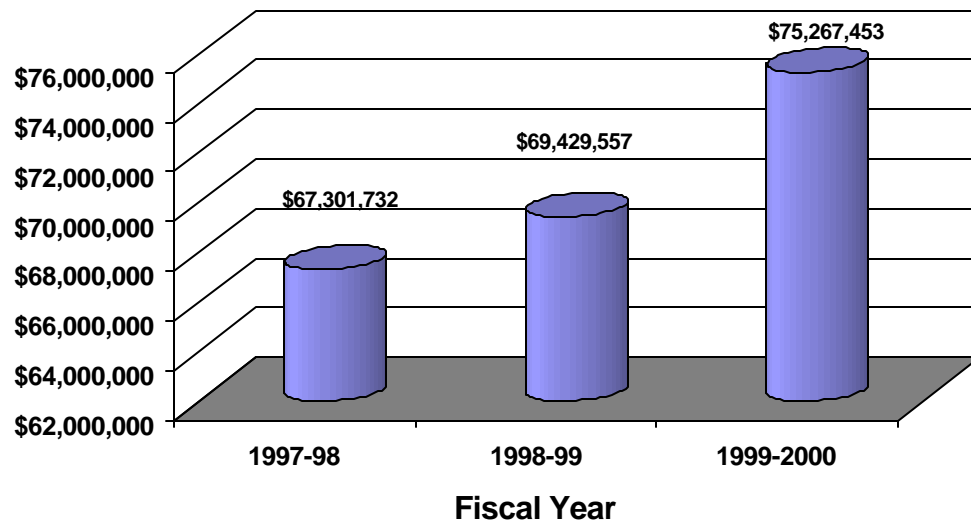
