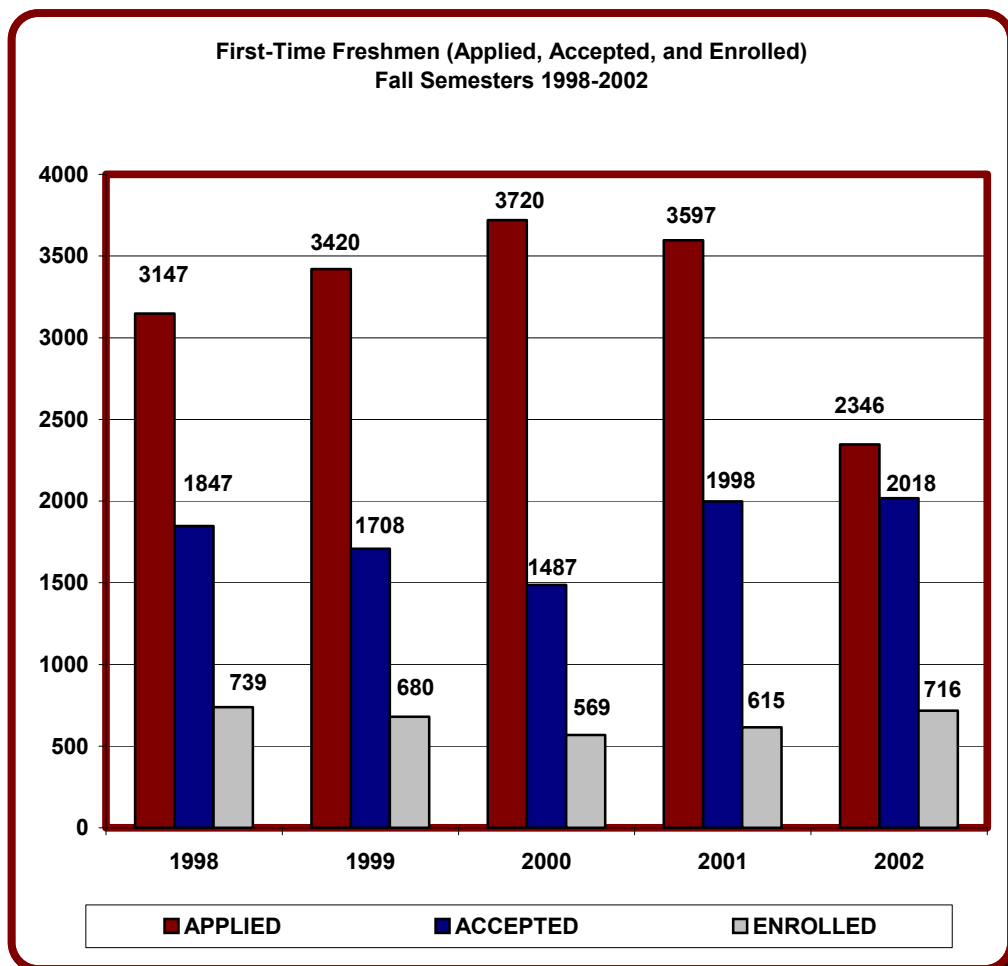

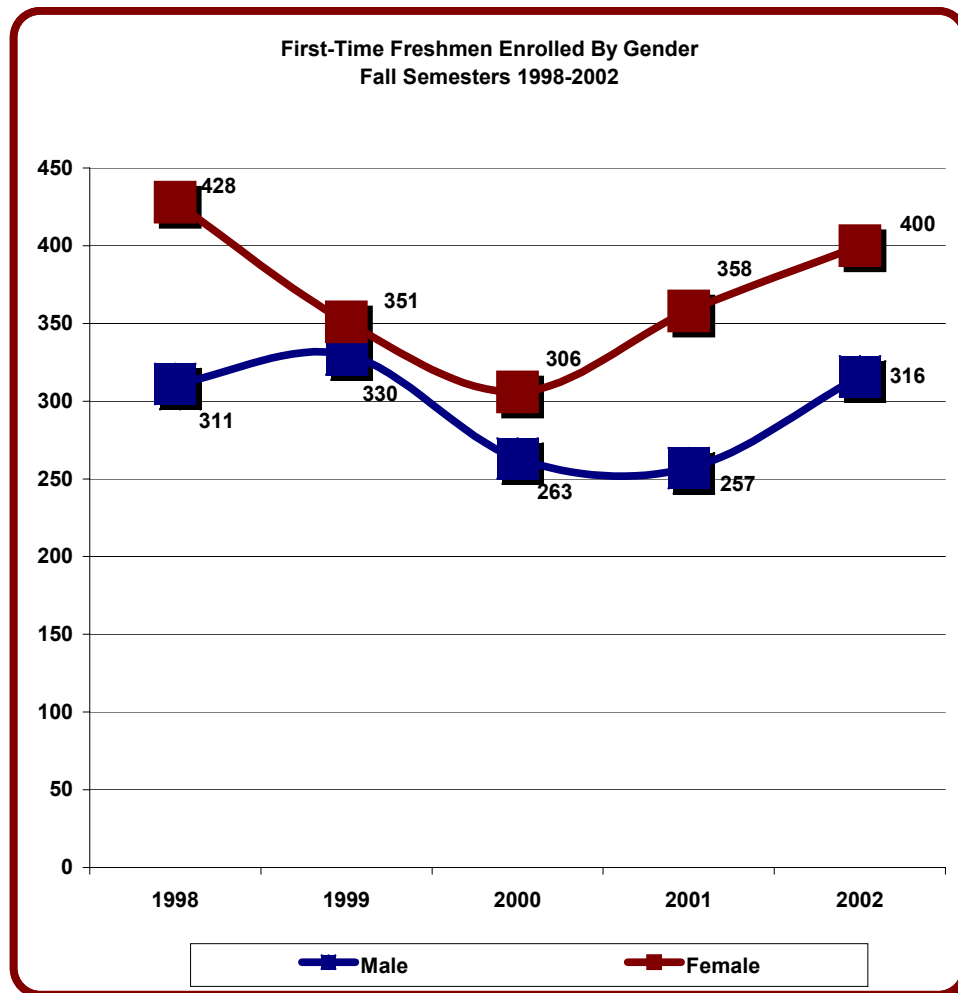

FALL SEMESTERS 1998 – 2002**

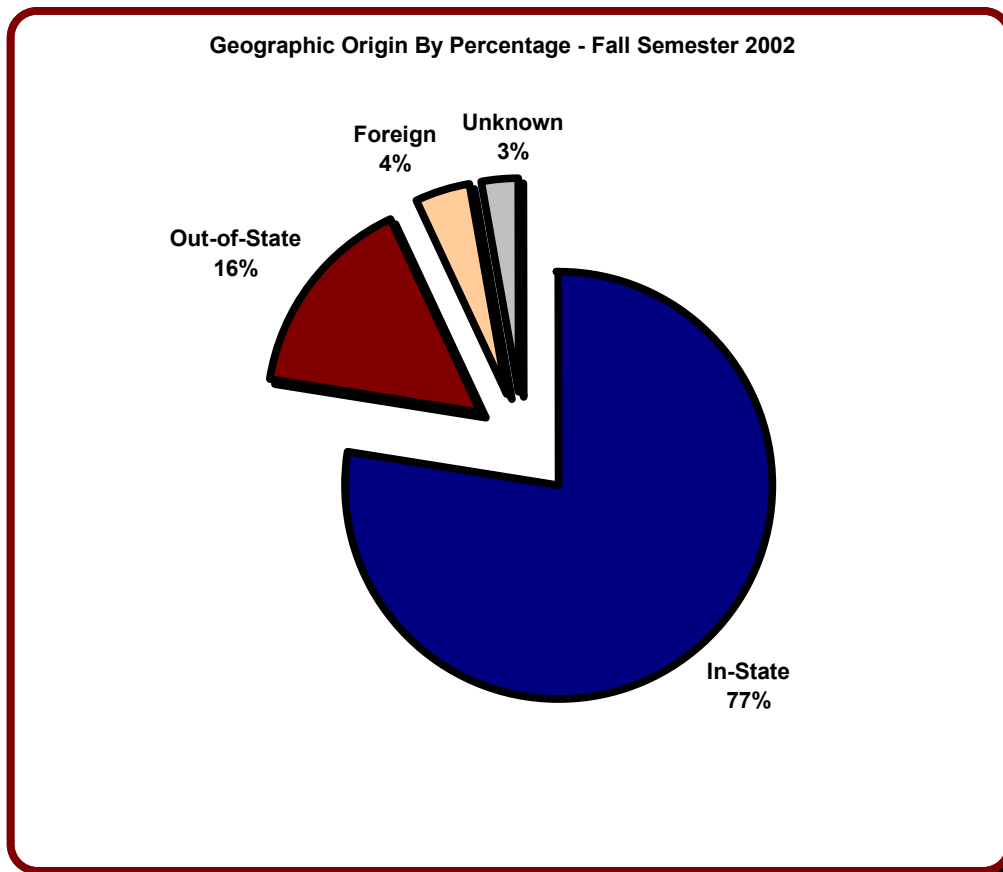

FALL SEMESTERS 1998 – 2002**

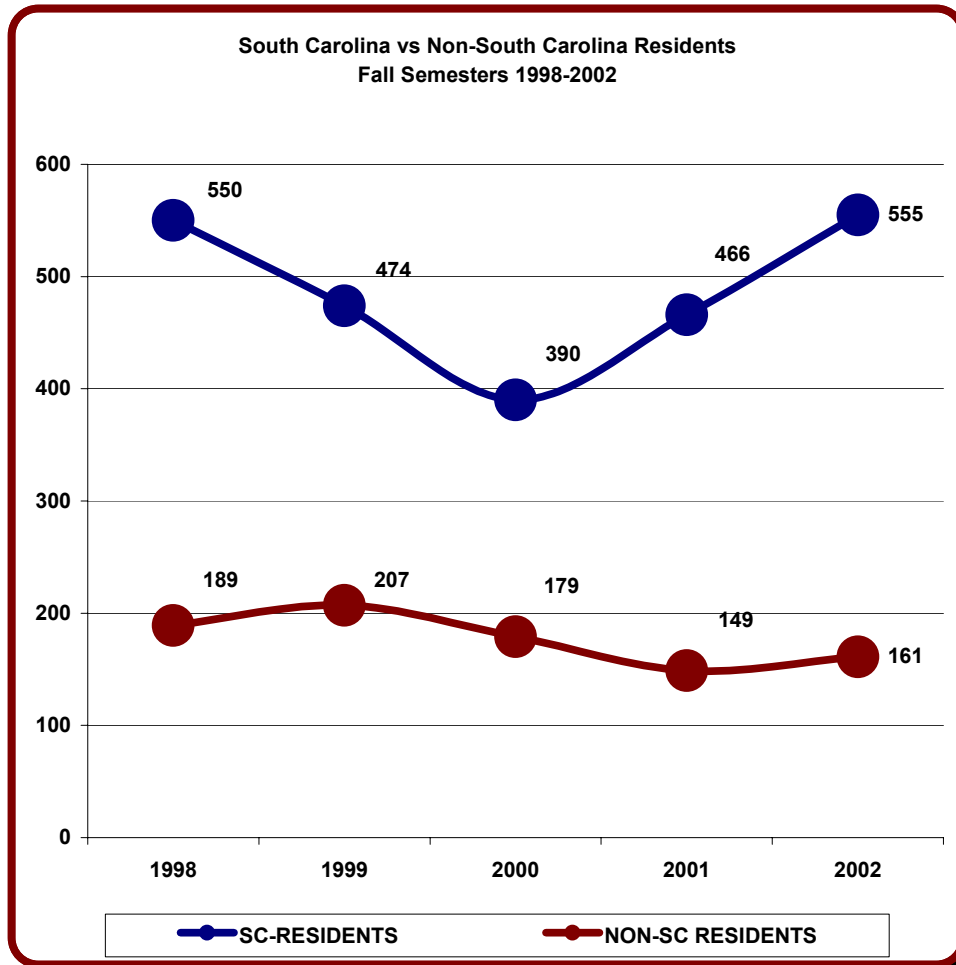

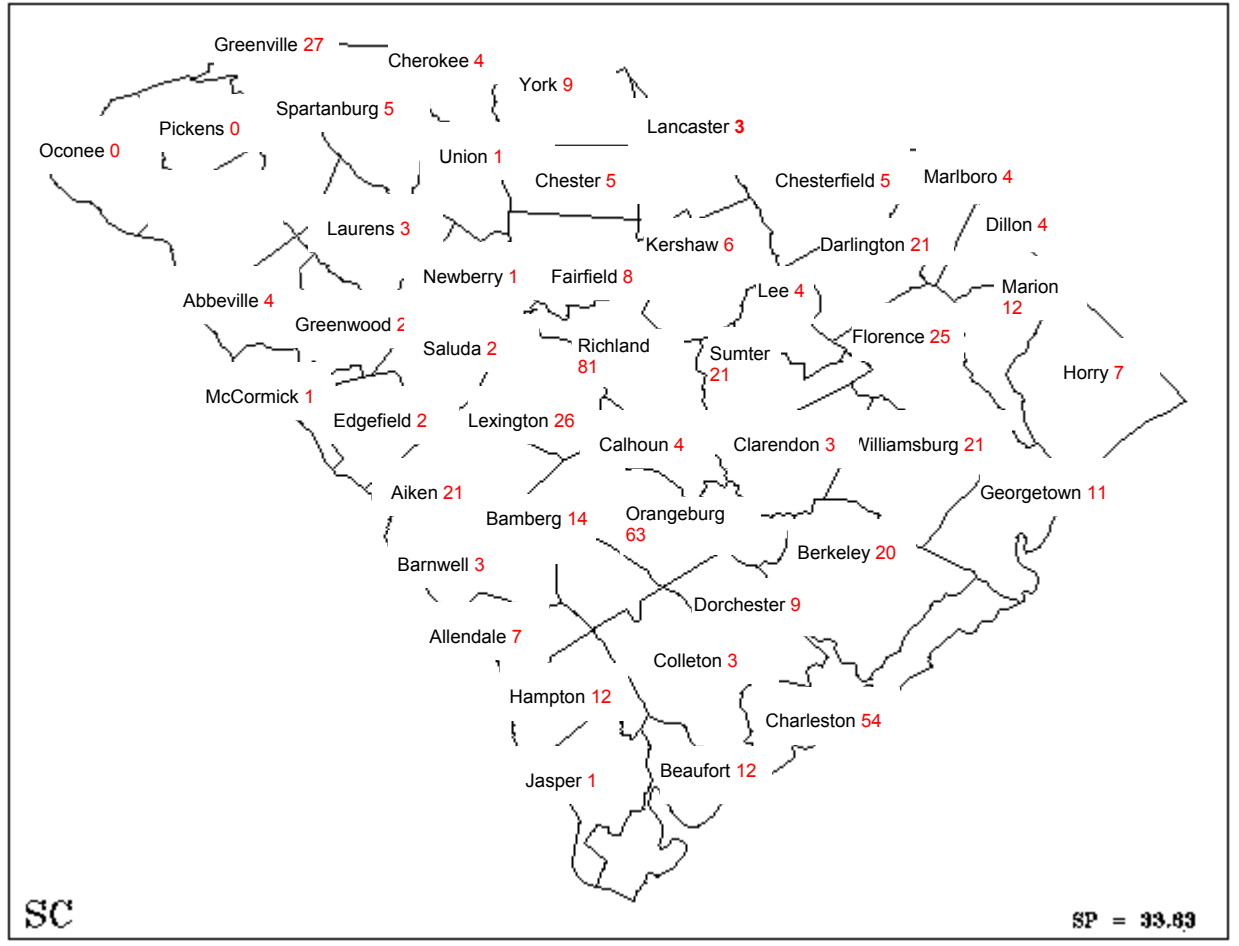

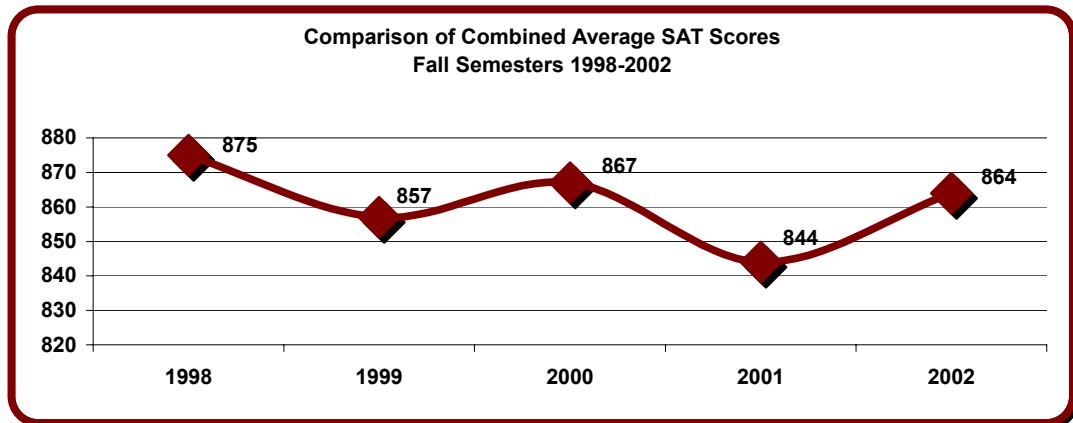

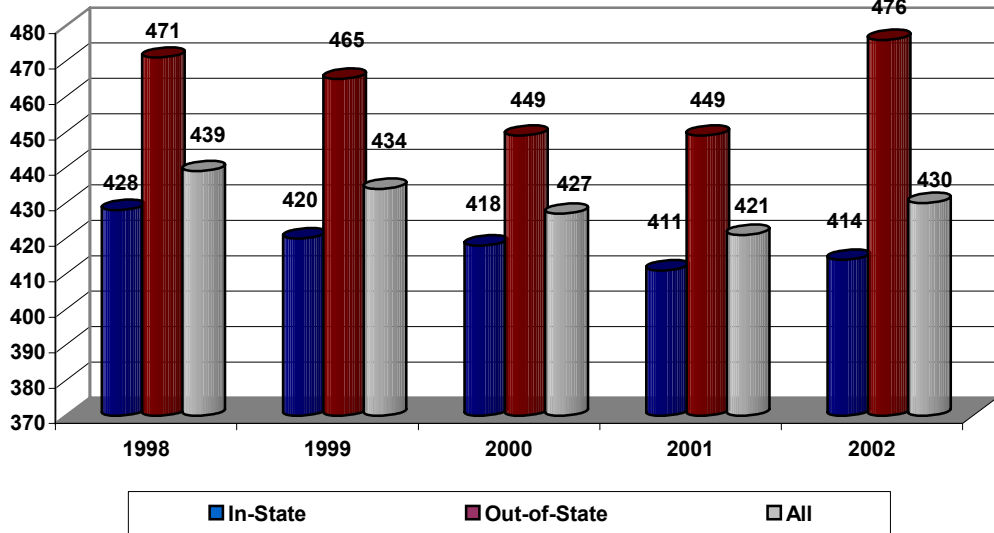

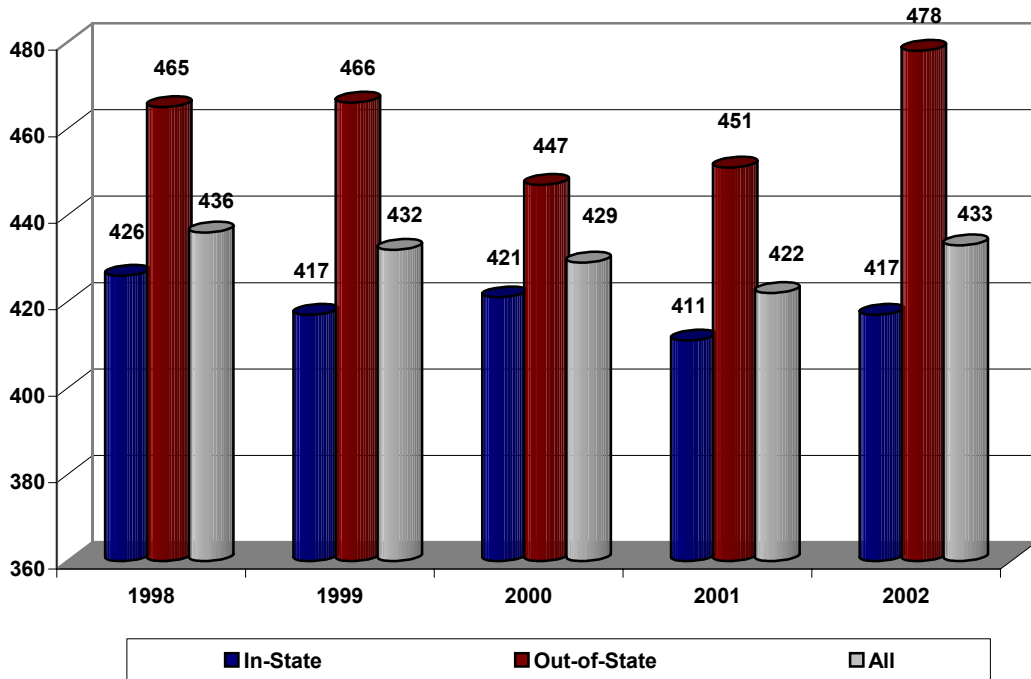

Fall Semesters 1998-2002



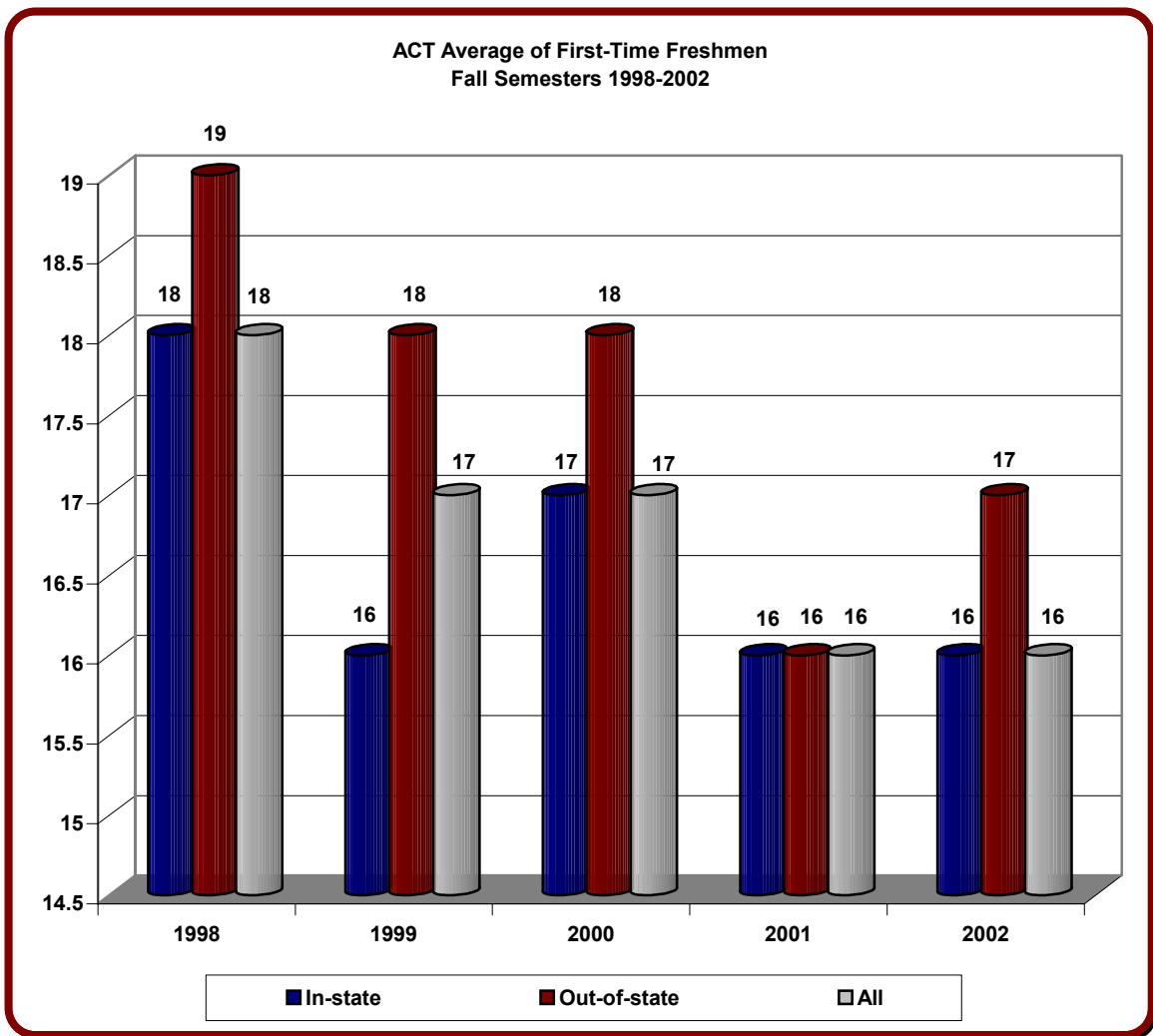
Comparison of Mathematics SAT Average for First-Time Freshmen

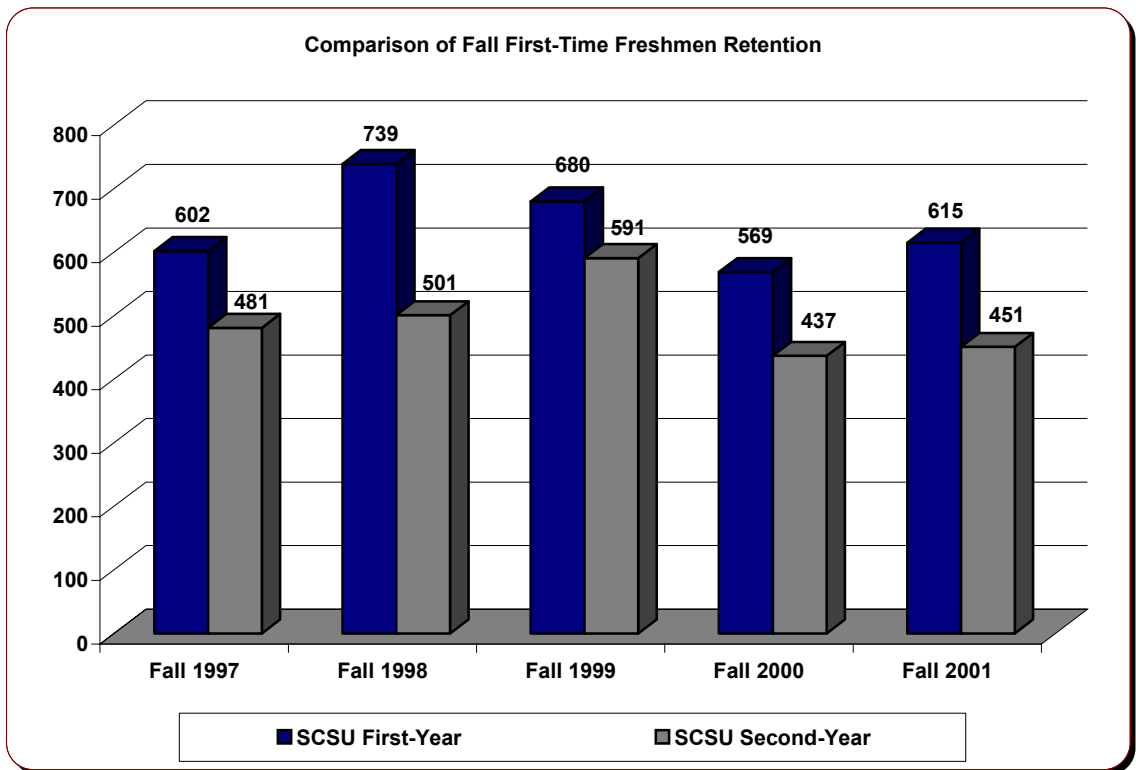

FALL SEMESTERS 1997-2002**

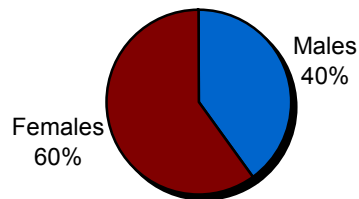

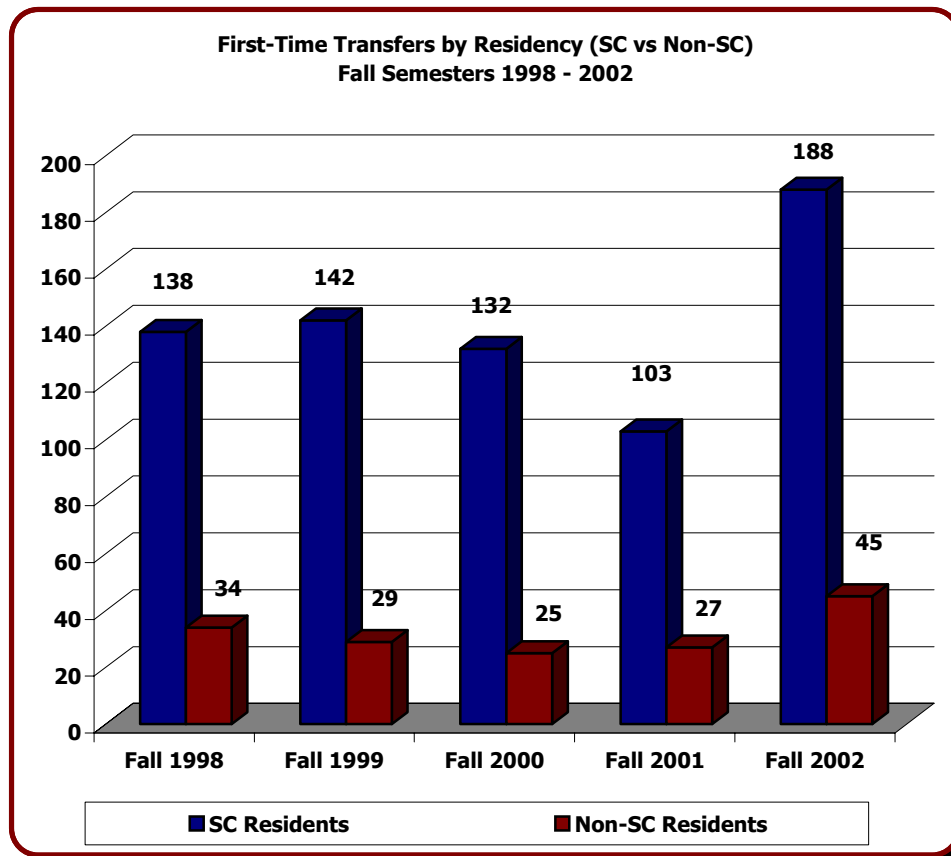

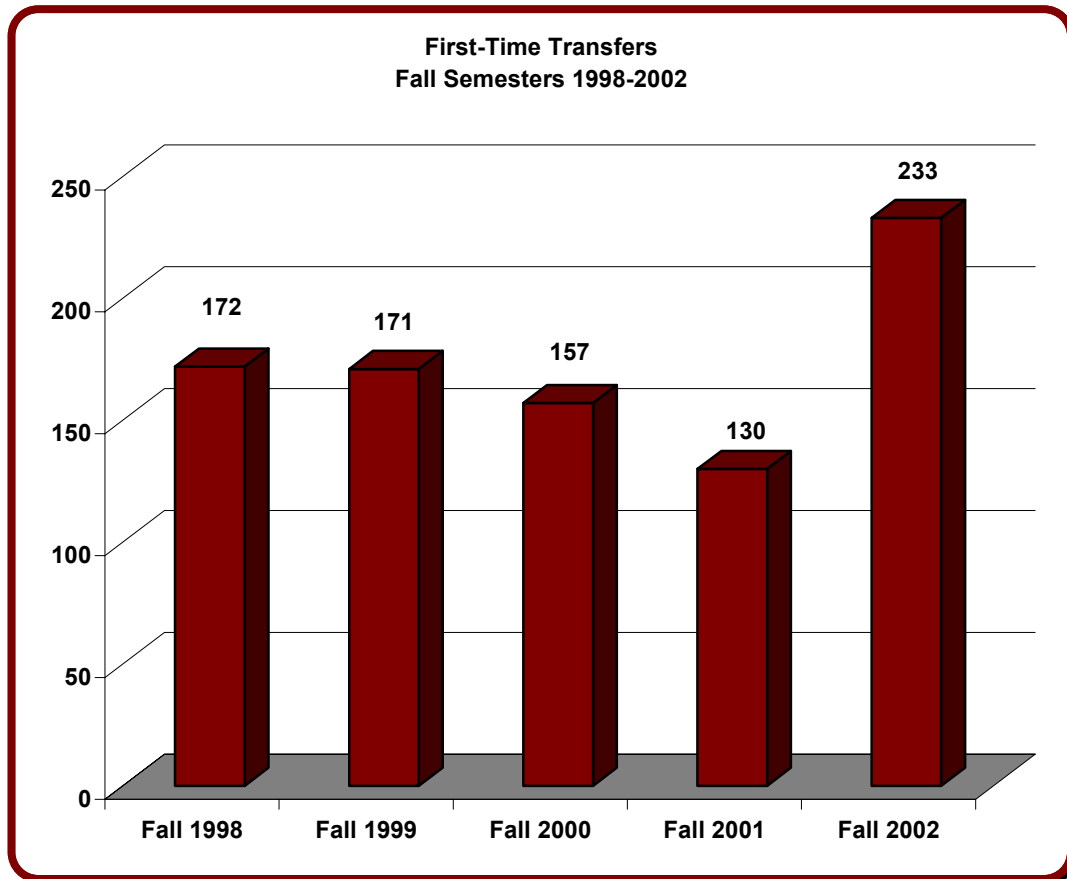
