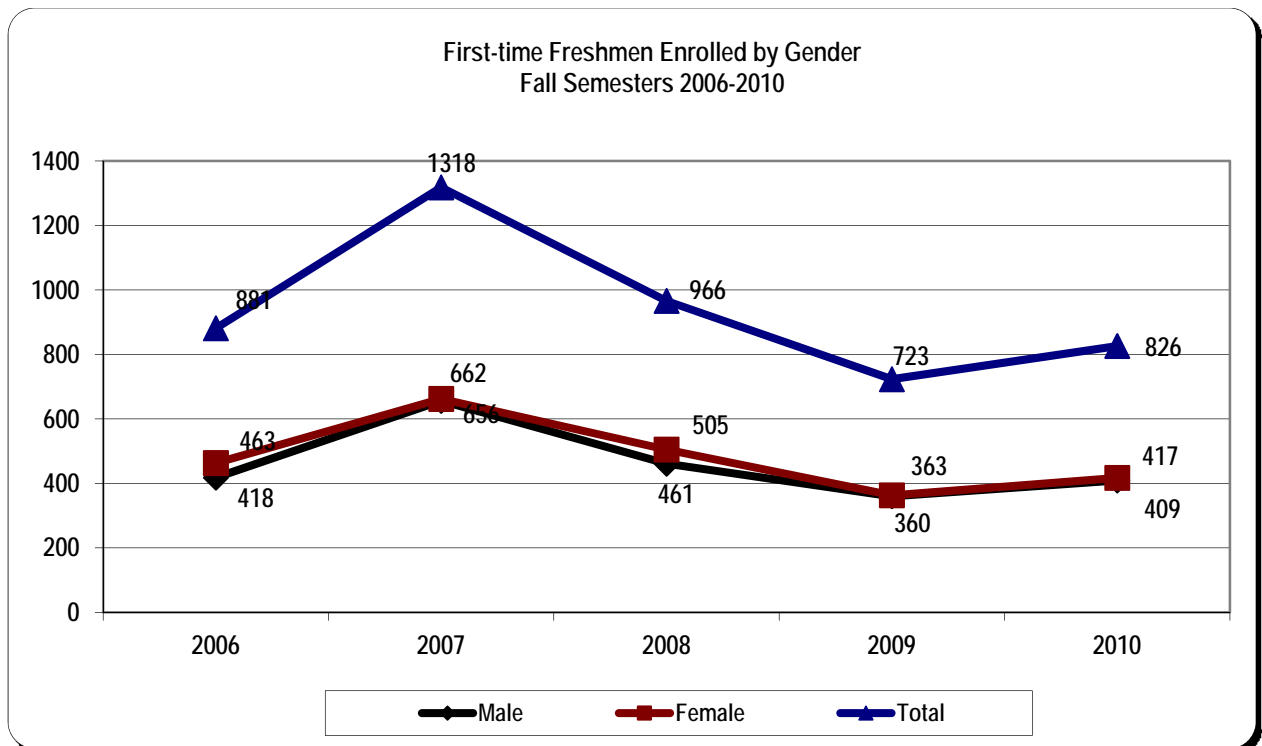

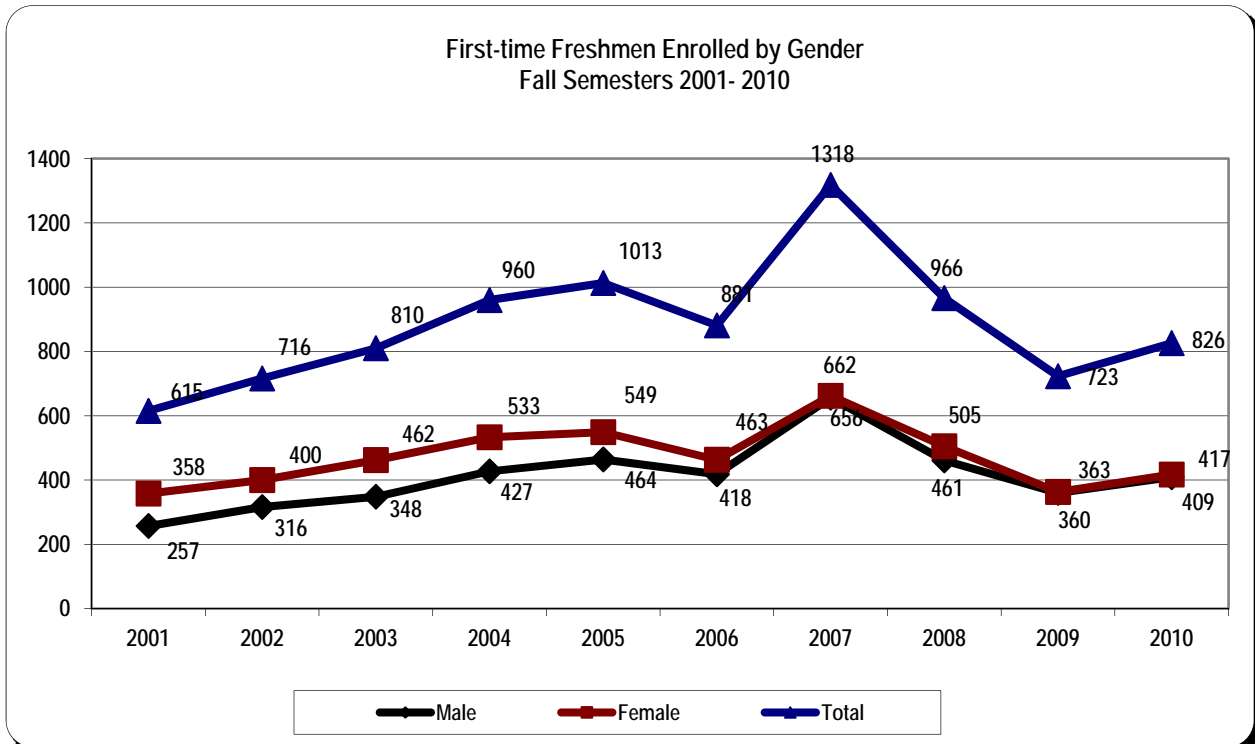

FALL SEMESTERS 2001 – 2010**

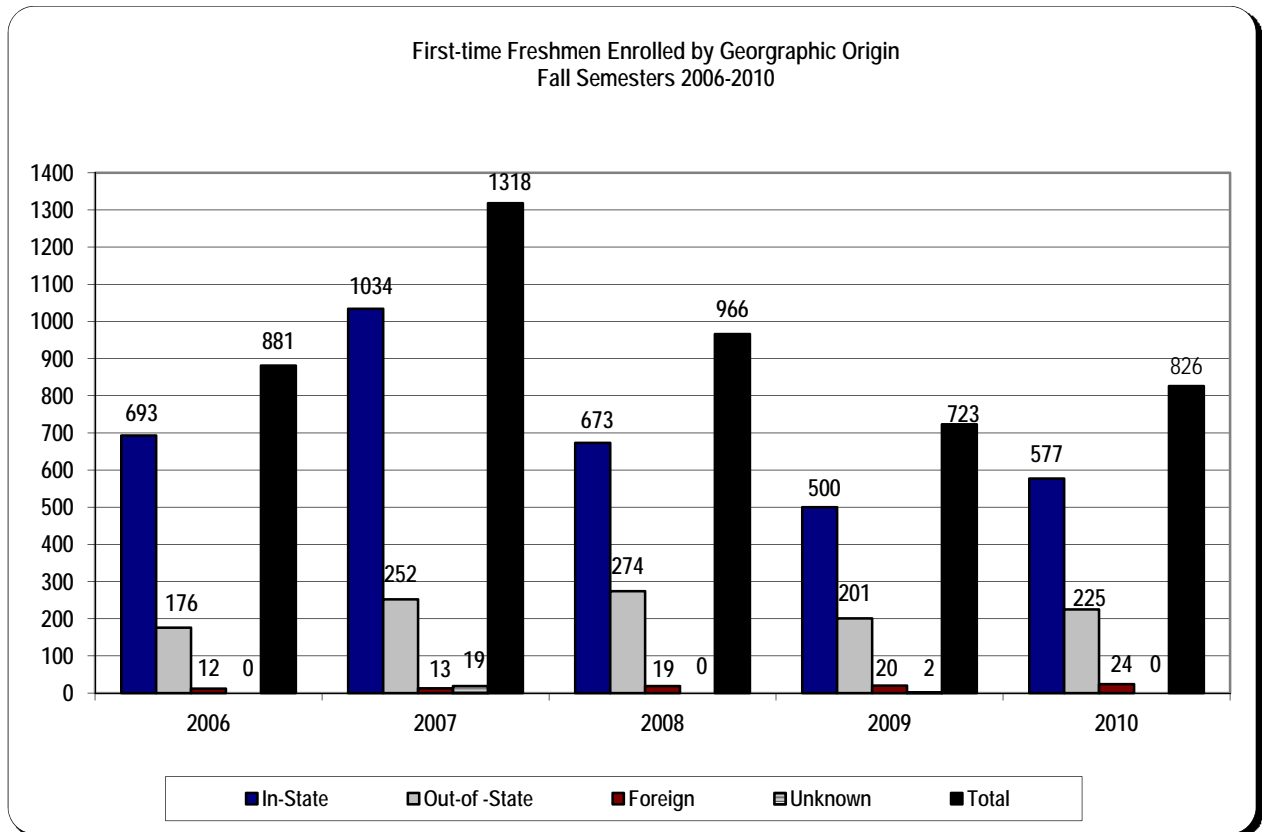

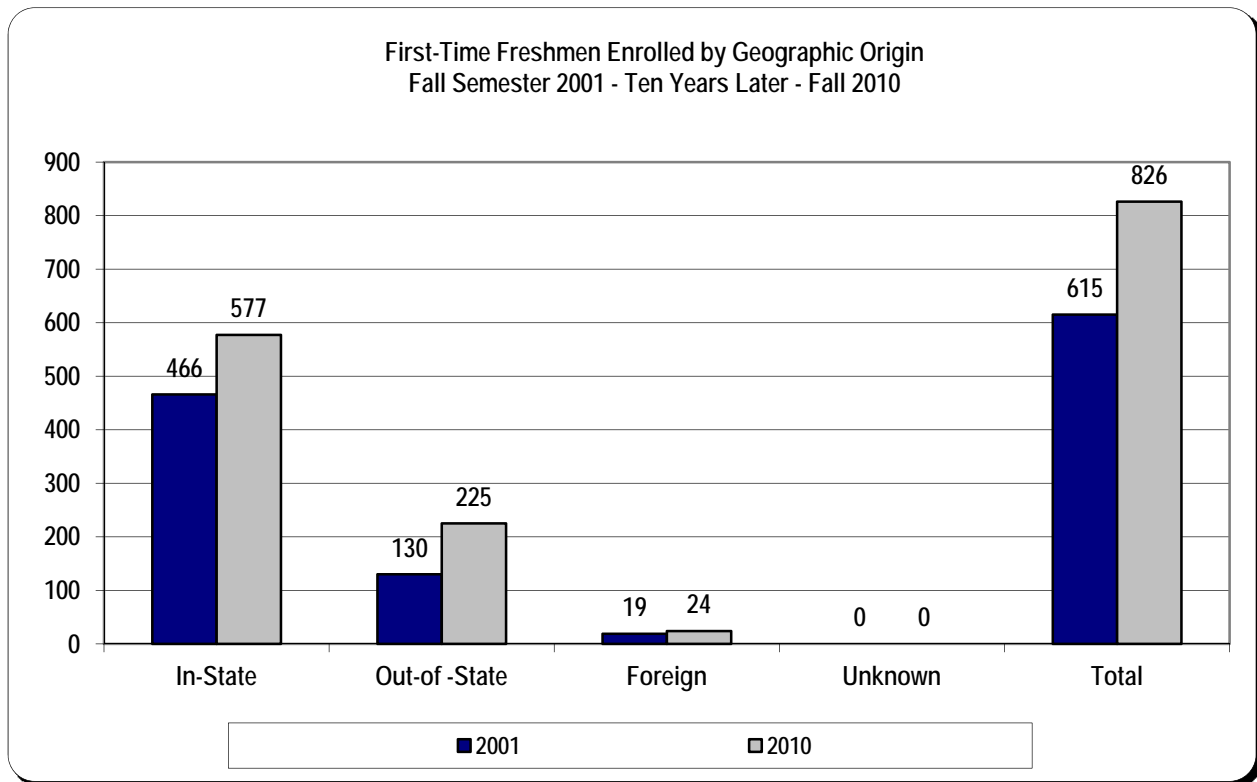

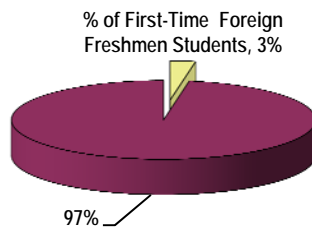
